



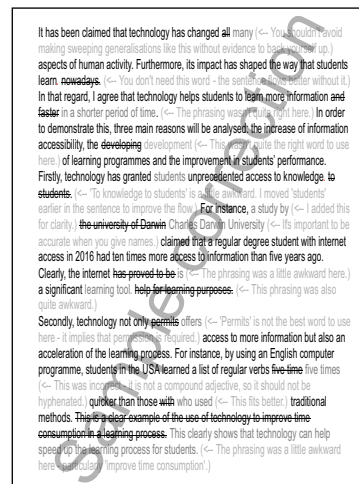
Welcome to my online course!

Here are a few tips to help you get the most out of our time together:

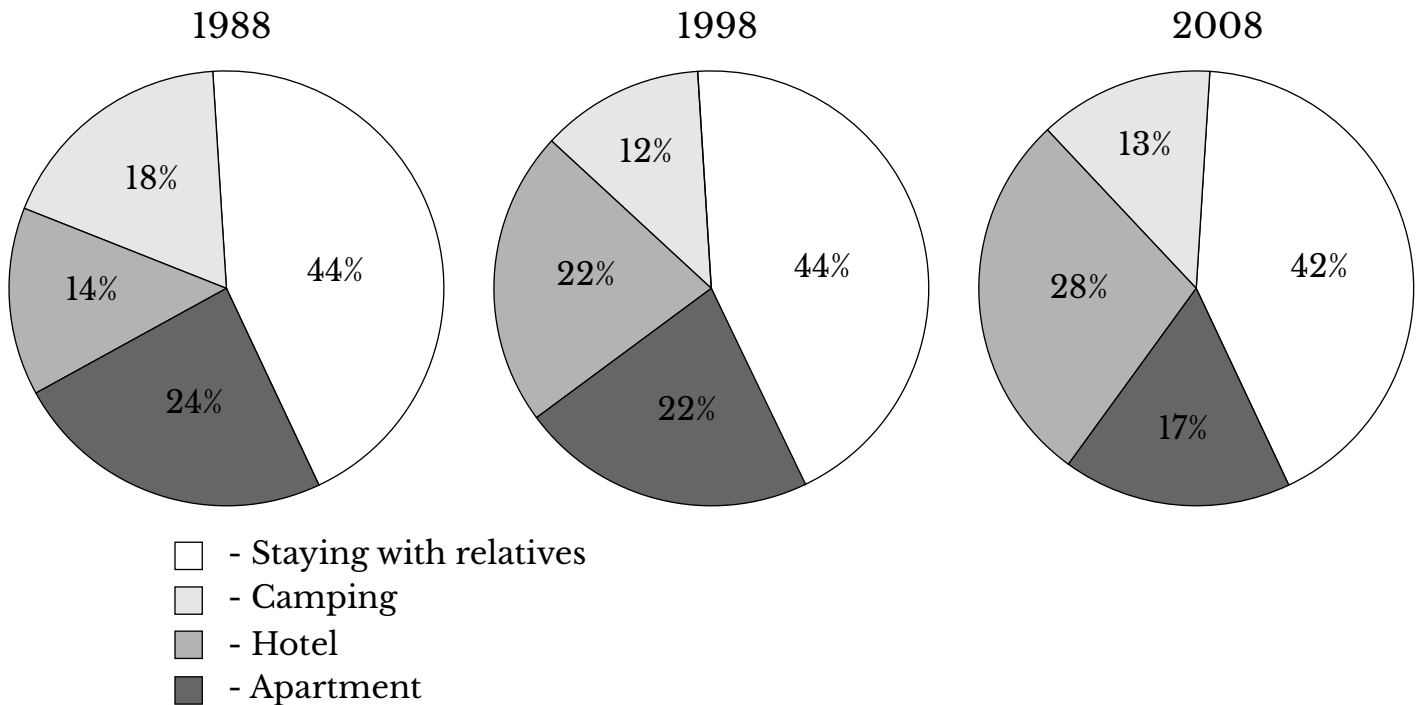
- Please review the free videos I make available from my YouTube channel, particularly those regarding Task 1 and 2 structure.

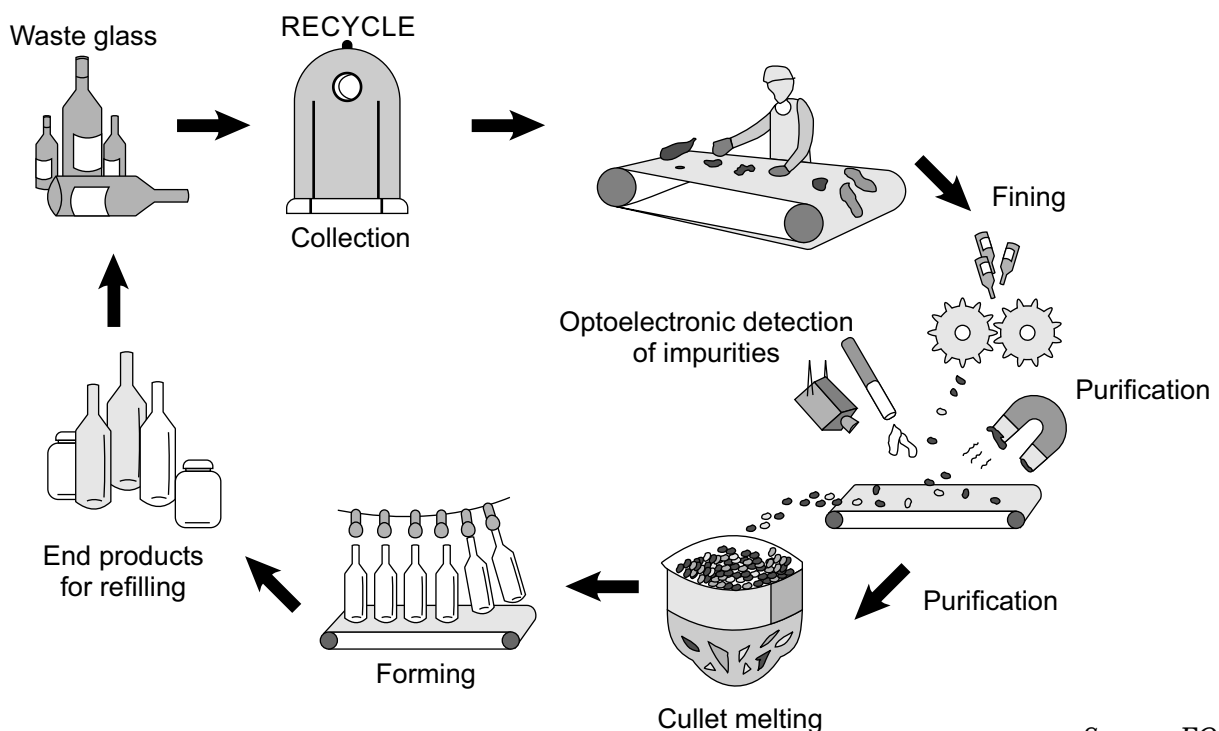
Question 1

The diagram below shows the process through which glass is recycled. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features. Make comparisons where relevant.

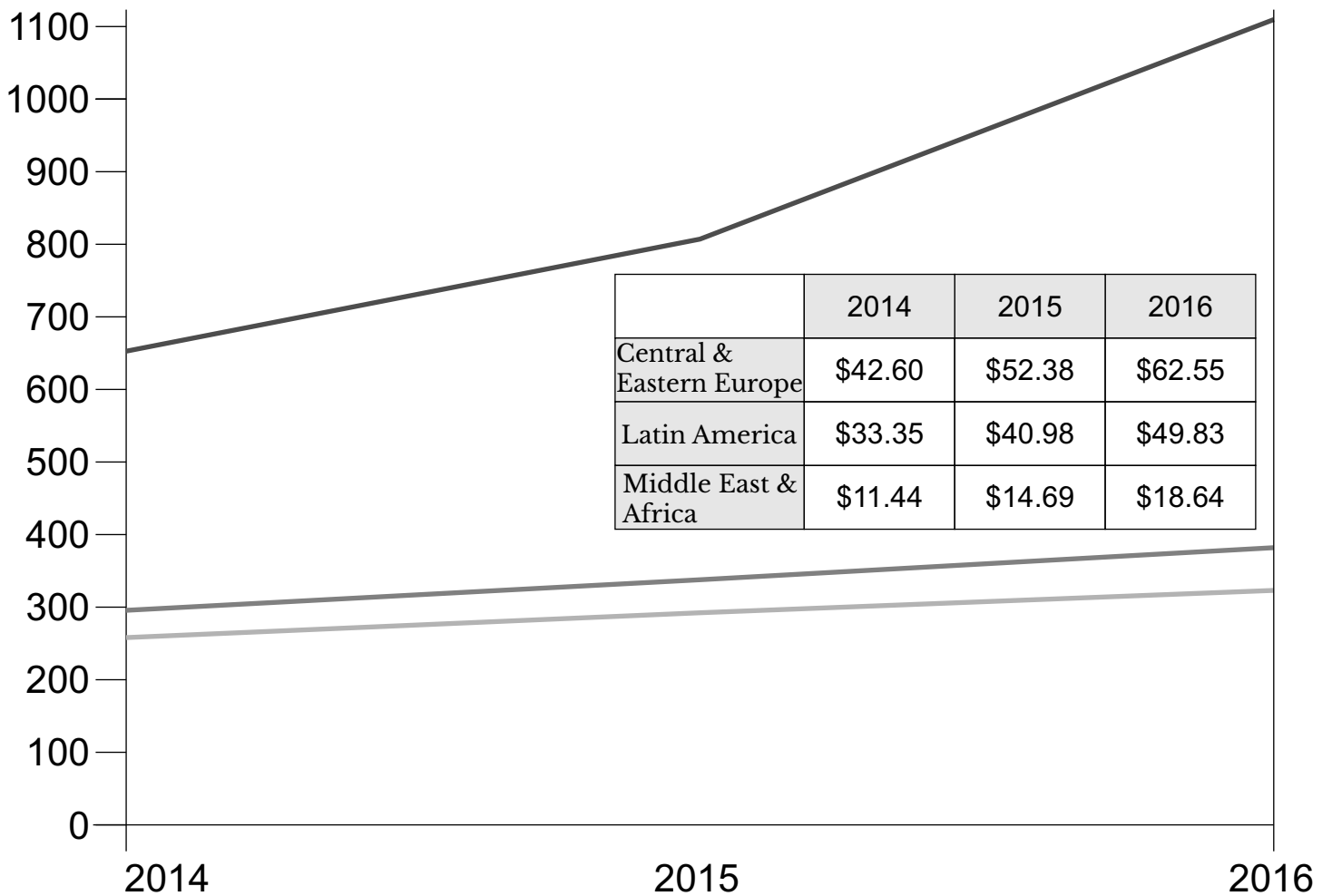

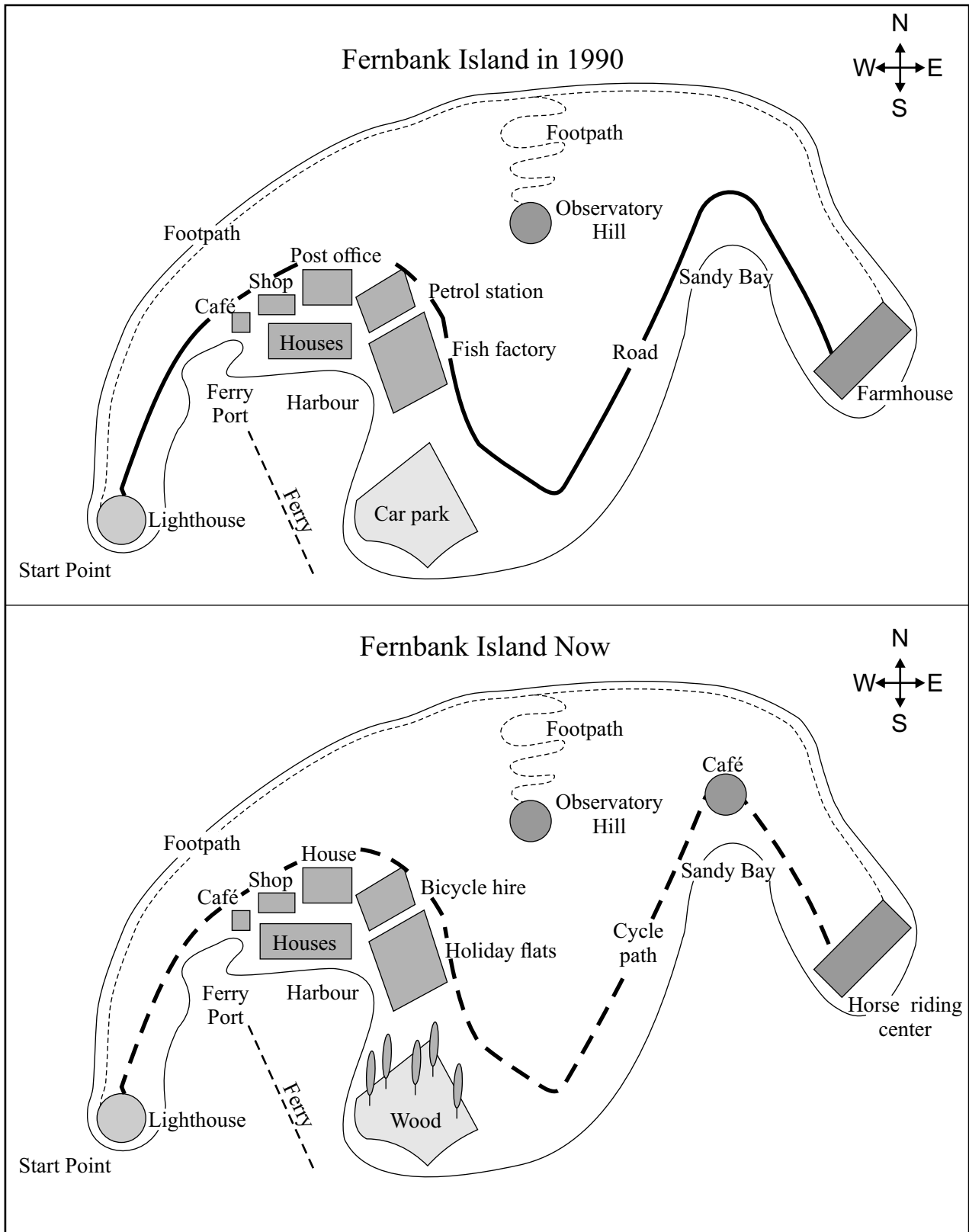

Write at least 150 words.

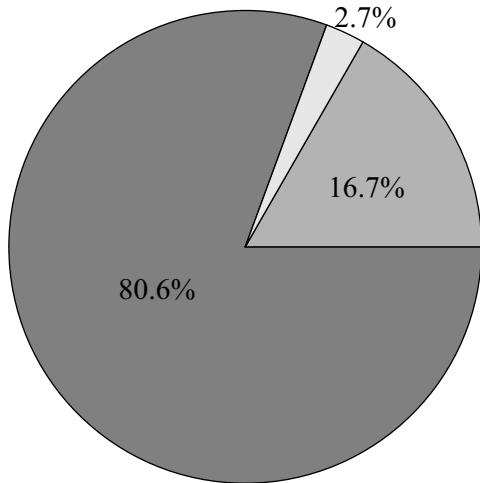

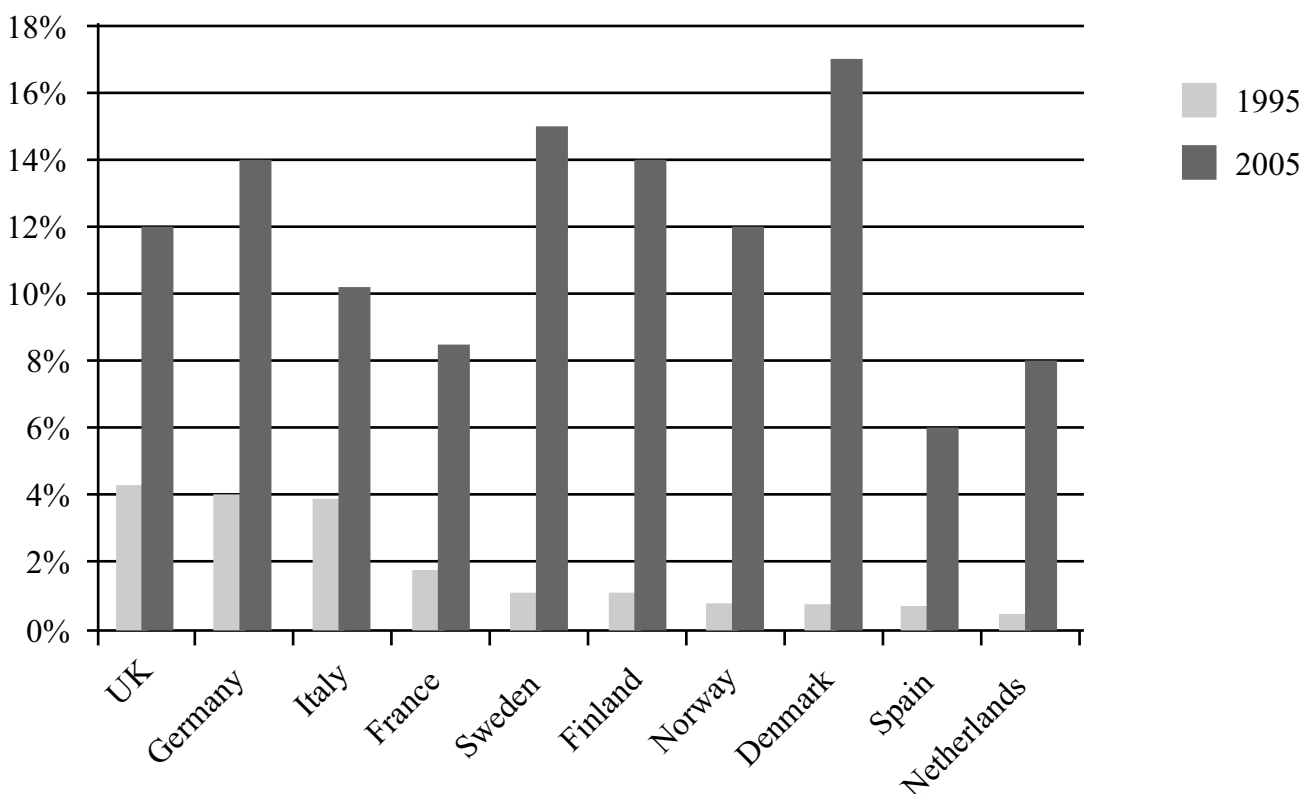

The graph below describes laptop computer ownership in several European countries. Write a report for a university lecturer that describes this process. Make comparisons where relevant.

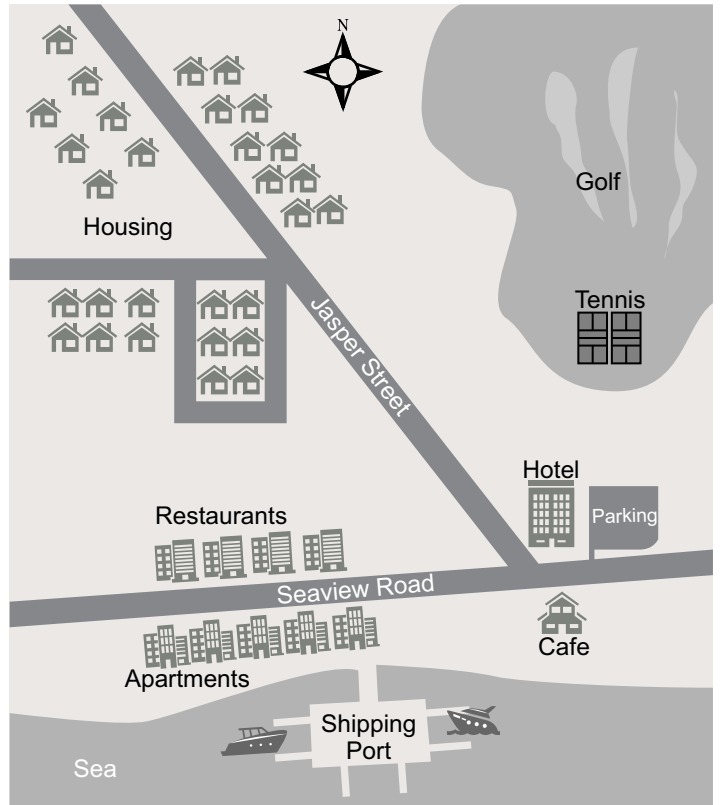
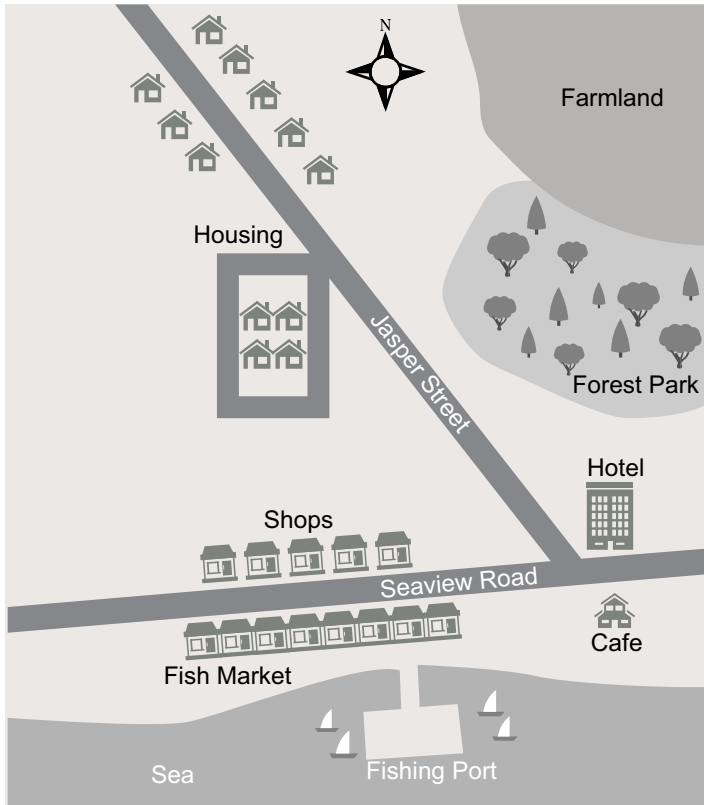
Laptop computer owners as percentage of national population

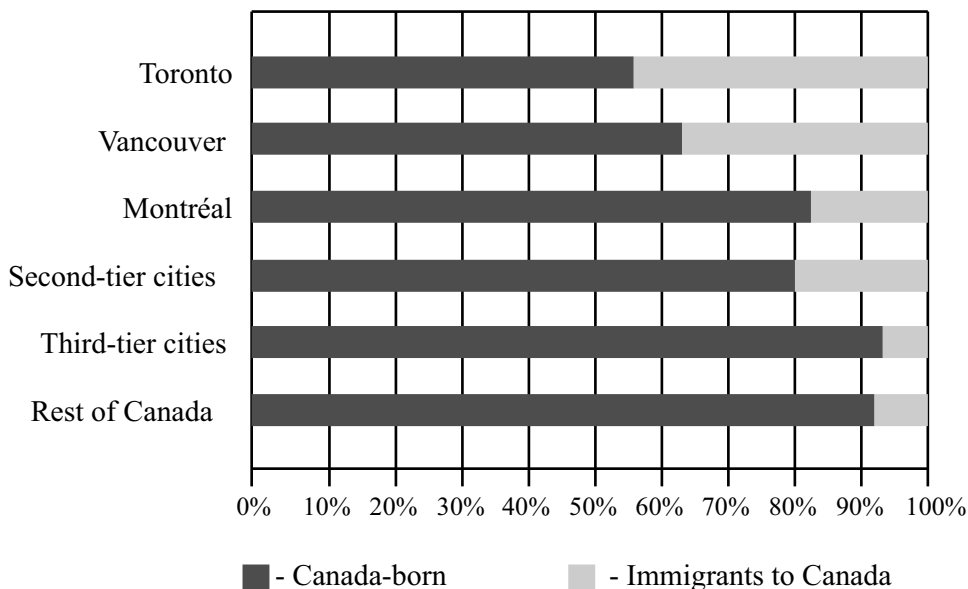
The maps below show the village of Richardson Pike in 1995 and present day. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features and make comparisons where relevant.



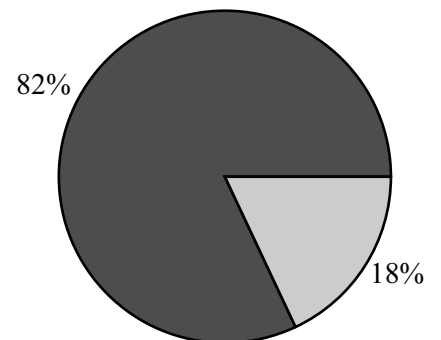

Migration patterns across Canada in 2001



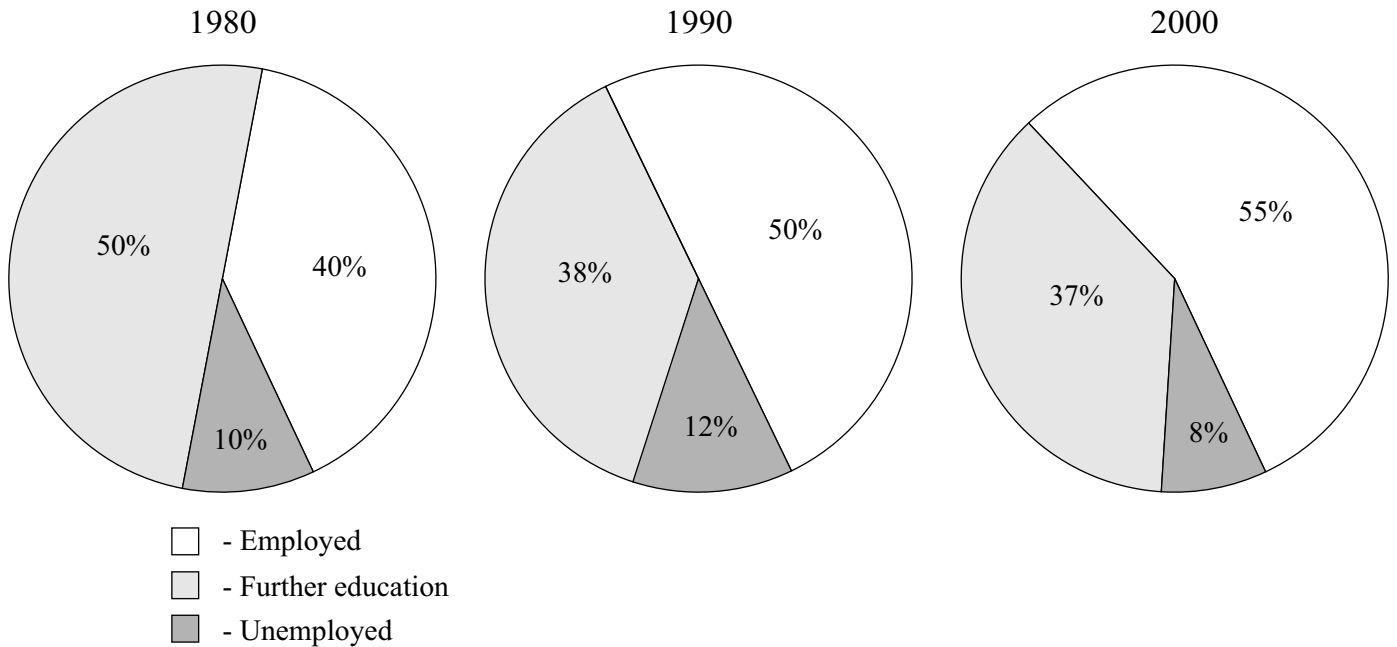
Canadian immigration averages in 2001

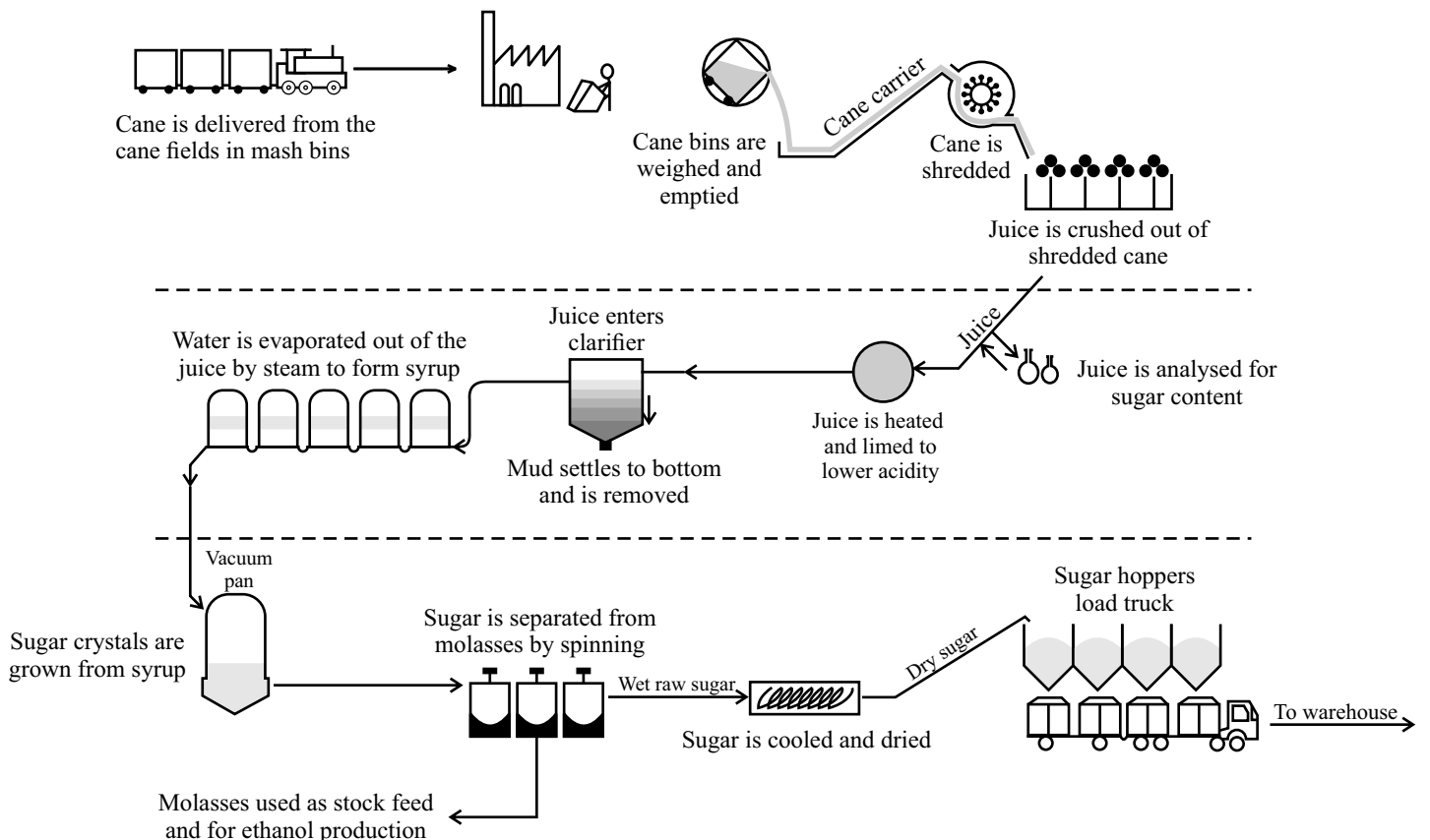

Question 1

Question 4

What are some alternatives to fossil fuels? Do you feel the world will ever stop using them?

Question 5

More and more students are going to another country for higher education. Do the advantages of this outweigh the disadvantages?

Question 6

It is difficult to experience a country fully as a tourist in a hotel. To appreciate and understand a country, a person needs to live there. To what extent do you agree or disagree?

Question 7

In universities, young women tend to choose arts programs while young men prefer science. What are the reasons for this trend and do you think this tendency should be changed?
